- •Established in 2007, Educate Girls' is a non-profit that focuses on mobilizing communities for girls' education in India's rural and educationally backward areas. Educate Girls' scalable, replicable and sustainable program model resides on top of India's 'Right to Education Act'.
- From a 500-schools pilot in 2007, Educate Girls has metamorphosed into a 24,000+ schools, over 18,000 villages across more than 33 districts in the states Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh & Bihar.
- •Since inception, Educate Girls has enrolled 1.4+ million Out-of-school girls (OOSG); 1.9+ million children have benefitted from the remedial learning curriculum. About the role:

The Gender and Skilling Expert will provide strategic and operational support to the WCD Department to strengthen gender-responsive skilling interventions and promote educational reintegration for adolescent girls and young women. The role involves designing and coordinating state-level strategies on gender, education, and livelihoods with a focus on convergence with key government schemes and programs like SAG, Mission Shakti, ASDM, and ASRLM.

In this role, you will be responsible for:

Strategy and Technical Support

- Support WCD in designing and rolling out second-chance education programs integrated with skilling opportunities for adolescent girls and young women.
- Provide technical expertise to align Assam State Open School (ASOS) curriculum with vocational and life skills under NSQF standards.
- Develop gender-responsive skilling roadmaps for high-priority districts identified through the landscape study.

Capacity Building and Stakeholder Coordination

- Work closely with ASDM, ASRLM, Education, and Panchayat Departments to ensure convergence of skilling and livelihood efforts for NEET girls.
- Build capacity of CDPOs, Supervisors, AWWs, and field functionaries on gender-responsive skilling and reintegration models.
- Facilitate linkages of trained girls with schemes like PMKVY, DDU-GKY, SHGs, and microenterprise development under Mission Shakti.

Community and Adolescent Engagement

- Support integration of counselling, life skills, digital literacy, and gender sensitization into skilling initiatives.
- Design and support implementation of outreach campaigns to mobilize out-of-school girls for open schooling and skilling pathways.
- Learn from and leverage Educate Girls' Team Balika and Pragati Preraks models for ground-level mobilisation. Integrate this approach in existing schemes to the extent it is practical.

Knowledge Management and Reporting

- Contribute to the development of training modules, IEC materials, and case studies that showcase innovative models.
- Provide monthly and quarterly progress reports to WCD and EG management on gender and skilling initiatives.
- Document best practices and support knowledge sharing across departments and districts.

- Master's degree in Social Work, Gender Studies, Education, Rural Development, or related fields.
- Minimum 5 years of experience in managing or supporting gender and skilling programs in collaboration with government systems.
- Proven understanding of NEET youth issues, open schooling systems (NIOS/ASOS), and vocational skilling under NSQF.
- Strong coordination skills and experience working with multi-stakeholder platforms and government departments.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team in a fast-paced, field-based environment.

Preferred Attributes:

- Experience in community mobilisation and participatory program design.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills in English and Assamese.
- Working knowledge of schemes like SAG, Mission Shakti, ASDM, SHG-based enterprise promotion.
- Ability to design and conduct gender and skilling-focused trainings.
